- Goal is to have a general final count of enrolment by Spring Break
- Academies:
 - 1) Hockey is full with some room in grade 12
 - o 24-25 students per group, 2 groups per grade
 - 2) Soccer some grades are full
 - Larger groups than hockey
 - 3) SPARK: working to promote this program, discussed focusing more on the STEM aspect to be clear what the program offers

5. Special Presentation: Mental Health

At the January meeting the survey results were reviewed. Results identified concerns with knowledge and access regarding mental health supports. Ms. Jordan Anstice and Ms. Victoria Saccomani presented on the 3 year plan for Comprehensive School Health Framework.

- The staff undertook a thorough process as a team to identify central themes and create a plan.
- The plan aims to address the whole school culture or "School Health" through the physical and social environment, success in learning, the home-school community relations and school policy. It is broken down into three priority areas.
 - Ensure mental health and well being education is a priority for staff and students

Goal #1: increase staff and student knowledge of mental health Goal #2: ensure students are accessing support in and information about how to deal with their mental health

Create a welcoming, caring and safe environment to support student and staff overall well being and happiness

<u>Goal #1</u>: create spaces within and outside of classrooms for optimal learning and achievement

<u>Goal #2</u>: staff visibility within the school environment to support positive student behaviour and relationship building

<u>Goal</u>: to create an inclusive supportive and professional atmosphere where all staff members feel valued, empowered and motivated to work collaboratively towards the schools shared mission
